Pupil Survey Results 2025/26

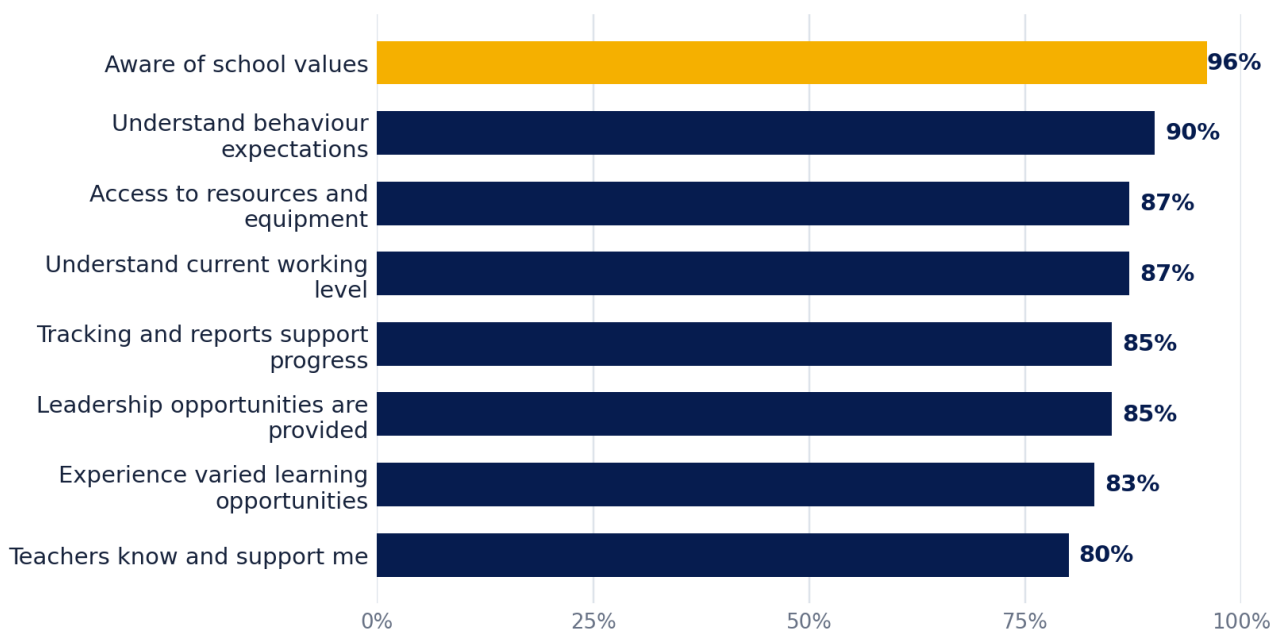
381 responses from S2-S6 pupils and recent leavers

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Where responses were strongest



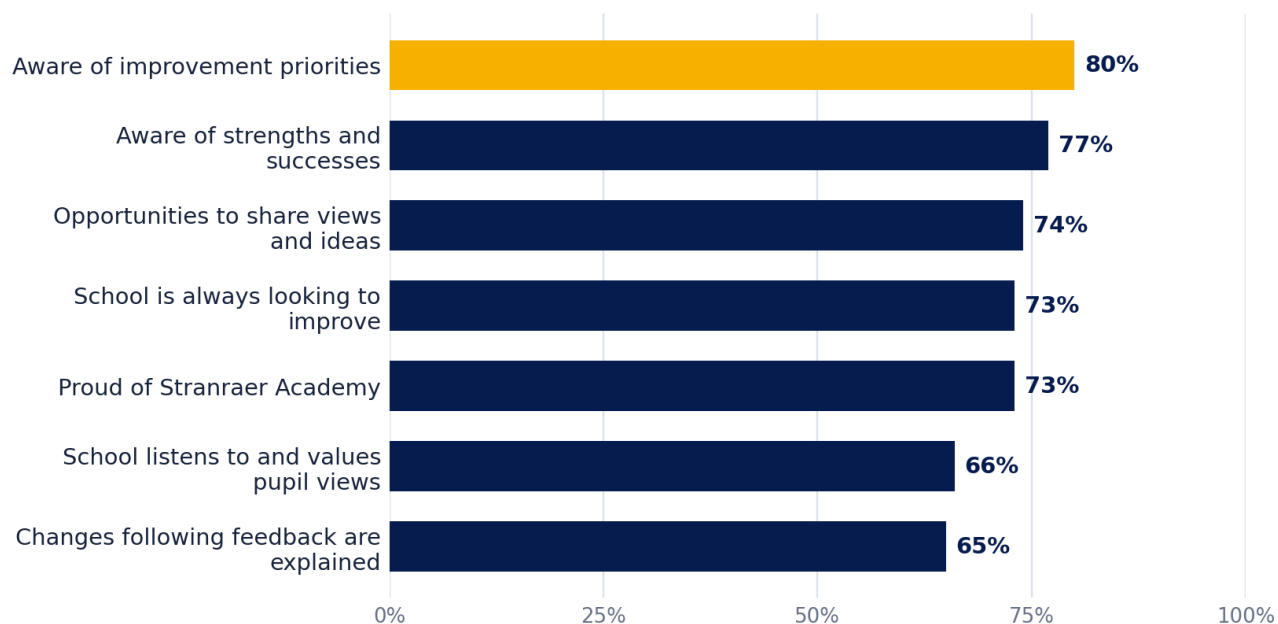
The strongest messages are pupils' awareness of our values, clear behaviour expectations, access to learning resources and the range of leadership opportunities available.

BEHAVIOUR, CURRICULUM AND NEXT STEPS

Understand expectations regarding behaviour and relationships	Most (90%)
Believe behavioural issues are dealt with fairly and appropriately	The majority (63%)
Believe positive behaviour is promoted and recognised effectively	Most (77%)
Believe curriculum choices and pathways meet needs and aspirations	Most (77%)
Believe learning develops skills for learning, life and work	Less than half (47%)
Believe the curriculum prepares pupils for their next stage	The majority (73%)
Are satisfied that the curriculum meets learners' needs	Most (76%)
Said option-choice support helped to a great or some extent	The majority (74%)

Options process: 192 pupils said they used the opportunity to discuss choices with Pupil Support or their Year Head. Of those responding to the support question, the majority (74%) said the information helped to a great or some extent.

What happens next

Show the impact of your views	Provide clearer, regular 'You said, we did' updates so pupils can see what changed following feedback.
Strengthen pupil voice	Build planned consultation into school and faculty improvement work and involve a wider range of pupils.
Focus on key experiences	Review how learning develops skills for life and work, how barriers are removed, and how behaviour issues are handled fairly.
